## Consultation about sustainable transport planning

The emerging East Riding Local Plan, and its associated documents, will identify the location, type and amount of development that will take place in the East Riding up to 2029, including new homes, shops and businesses.

The council has recently published the Draft Sustainable Transport Supplementary Planning Document, March 2014, and accompanying Sustainability Appraisal Scoping Report for public consultation. The closing date for responses is Monday, 4 August.

The draft document provides guidance about :

- travel planning, parking provision and design
- producing a travel plan and when a travel plan is needed
- appropriate levels of parking on new developments.

## Greater flexibility for business premises to change their use

Those who took part in the recent planning liaison meetings will have heard about changes introduced by the Government to give greater flexibility for businesses and farmers to make changes of use without a planning application.

Generally the changes will still require an application for Prior Approval. In some cases the only requirement is to notify the council of the proposed change. Where Prior Approval is required, the council can only consider and assess the specified matters to be considered, such as flooding and traffic impact.

The changes are quite complex, but the council recognises their importance to businesses and recently sent a guidance note to town and parish councils to help councillors understand the new flexibilities. The general guidance is only a summary of the changes permitted and cannot provide a definitive explanation of the detailed restrictions and qualifications that apply.

### Premises Licences for village halls

The Licensing Act 2003 brought in a complete change to the licensing of regulated entertainment. Since it was implemented, in 2005, there have been a number of changes that impact on village halls and community venues.

The changes include a relaxation of the need for licences for some types of events taking place between 8am and 11pm on any day:

- a play in the presence of an audience of 500 or less
- an indoor sporting event in the presence of an audience of less than 1,000
- dances for fewer than 500
- some types of live music.

### Crime Reduction Fund

The police and crime commissioner has launched a £1.5 million fund open to voluntary and community groups and organisations in the East Riding of Yorkshire. Approximately £235,000 will be available each year for the next four years for small-scale projects that will provide sustainable answers to local problems that help and reduce crime.

The funding can be used for capital and revenue projects and cover a range of activities, such as targeted crime reduction and community safety initiatives, capacity-building, raising awareness, training and research and buying equipment and materials.

Proposals must show they support the priority outcomes set out in the Police and Crime Plan 2013-2017 for Humberside. Applications can be submitted at any time throughout the year and will be assessed at set times during the year. ## Let's Get Moving

This mobile health programme has been developed by the sport, play and arts service to promote independence, increase activity levels and reduce isolation by offering quality, fun and informal activity sessions across the East Riding for adults 50+ and adults with a disability.

The activities are offered to a group as one-off taster sessions, usually one hour long. If successful, a six-week block of activities can be offered. All of the sessions are free-of-charge and all equipment is provided. The sessions can take place in a variety of locations like village halls, sheltered housing and care homes.

There is a wide range of activities, including new-age kurling, soft bowls (boccia), skittles, sitting-down volleyball and tennis, fun golf and golf-putting. Art and craft examples include card-making, painting, clay modelling and jewellery making. There are other activities like fun quizzes, giant Connect 4 and Jenga.

The programme includes 'Mature Mayhem', a fun programme that brings older people together, rediscovering their playful nature. All activity sessions offered are designed to be relaxed and to suit all ability levels and can be tailored to include what activities the group wants from the list provided.

Market Weighton is again holding its 'big' day. On Sunday, 13 July, the High Street and Market Place will be closed for a free, fun, family event from 11-4pm.
